Philip's Focus

Rising Tide

Have you ever noticed we have many "SHIPS" in the church? Our church is a harbor for DiscipleSHIP, StewardSHIP, MemberSHIP, and FellowSHIP. The old saying is also true "A rising tide lifts all ships." Notice this Auburn fan said "Rising Tide" and not "Roll Tide." A rising tide does lift all boats. This is certainly true with SHIPS in the church.

DiscipleSHIP is the mission of the church. Our aim is to grow as disciples and to make disciples. We grow as disciples when we live and learn the teachings of Jesus. As we encourage others, we help others grow as disciples. DiscipleSHIP is a daily endeavor. We seek to become more like Jesus every day. As the original twelve disciples followed Jesus, we too seek to follow Jesus.

StewardSHIP is our journey of giving back to God through the local church. StewardSHIP is a response to our MemberSHIP vows of PRAYERS, PRESENCE, GIFTS, SERVICE, and WITNESS. These big five commitments remind us we are to PRAY for others and the ministry of the church. We commit to being PRESENT in the church unless we are prevented. God has given us GIFTS to use for his glory. We are to give financially in response to all the blessings God has given to us and tithing is the priority of giving God the first ten percent of our income. Our giving also includes our time and particular gifts we have to use in the Body of Christ. All of our gifts used together raises the level of ministry through our congregation. We are all to SERVE. Jesus said, "Whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant." (Matthew 20:26) All of us are called to serve. Finally, when we join the church we also affirm the vow of WITNESS for Jesus Christ. We are to let our light shine for Jesus in both words and deeds. When we all witness, Shalimar UMC becomes what this newsletter describes as a BEACON - a light for Jesus!

One other Ship of the Church is FellowSHIP. In the early church, no not 8:00 am service, but in the original Church we read they did so much together in a spirit of Koinonia. Koinonia is a Greek word describing a deeper level of fellowSHIP where you share the journey of following Christ together. In particular they broke bread together. Something special happens when we gather in the name of Jesus Christ and we eat together. Those scones and coffee at fellowship time does more than just appease a hunger. The scones are symbolic of our need to build relationSHIPS together. Our building relationSHIPS in the church really does matter.

One of the ways God moves through a church is through building our fellowSHIP with each other. One of the hopes of our short sermon series on *Be Our Guest* is that we will build fellowSHIP together and be more intentional about welcoming all into the Church at Shalimar UMC! This building a loving FellowSHIP is huge in building up the church.

Worship: A Weekly Event or a Daily Lifestyle?

“So here’s what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going to work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering.” Romans 12:1 (MSG)

In the time I have been here, I have been very impressed with the worship here at Shalimar UMC. This is a praying, praising, singing, Bible-reading congregation! We praise God with musical instruments (Psalm 150), preaching the Word, giving offerings, the sacraments as well as outreach, mission, and evangelism. We also praise God when we offer testimony to others of what God has done for us. But let’s be honest, sometimes when the worship is over, we go back to our everyday lives as if there is little connection between our careers and our faith. My question for you this week: Is worship what you do one day a week or do you worship God in many ways throughout the week?

I will always remember the motto of one of the youth leaders I once worked with: “Let your work be worship and let your worship be work.” He taught us that everything we do can be an offering to God. Seen in this way, worship is not an event to cap off the week, but a continual way of life.

In the second century AD, before Christianity was an official religion, many Roman officials preferred to hire Christians for important tasks, such as handling money or dealing in confidential matters. They knew that Christians were honest and trustworthy. Christians knew that everything they did reflected on their Lord, Jesus Christ, as much as on themselves or their family. The work they did gave glory to God.

Brother Lawrence was a monk who took seriously the admonition to “pray without ceasing” (1 Thess 5:16), and endeavored to make communion with God a natural and continuous state of being. In *The Practice of the Presence of God*, he wrote, “There is not in the world a kind of life more sweet and delightful, than that of a continual conversation with God; those only can comprehend it who practice and experience it.” When he worked in the monastery kitchen, every menial task took on new meaning for him as an offering to God. Every moment of drudgery became more delightful when he experienced it as a conversation with God. Is it possible for us in our twenty-first century lives to have such a dedication to God? I think so.

I once visited a parishioner in her place of work. She toiled away at a sewing machine, in a room full of sewing machines, making blue jeans. It had all the marks of a sweatshop: musty smell, concrete floors, no windows, one (male) floor boss among a sea of women who would have retired years ago but for some misfortune they suffered earlier in life. When she saw me her eyes lit up, and she

could not wait to show me the details of her job. She knew all the important things to look out for when double stitching the seams of blue jeans. It made me smile to see the obvious pride and joy she found in doing a simple thing well. Her enthusiasm transported her away from the dreary factory to a place of continual praise. That's worship! As we make that shift from worship as an event to worship as a lifestyle, our praise of God never ceases, but spills out into every facet of our lives.


