Philip's Focus

Seven Weeks and Seven Practices...The 46 Day Lenten Challenge

Our congregation has had a phenomenal start to 2018 with Awakening. I have been asked on several occasions what is next? My prayers and searching keep leading me to the conclusion that our congregation needs to be challenged right now. We do not need the status quo. We need a catalyst to spark us through the Lenten season. A Challenge is good for our congregation! Challenges draw us closer to God and cause us to rely on the power of the Holy Spirit.

Challenge is a wonderful word. I understand challenge as something that calls for us to reach deeper and see if we are up to a specific test. Challenges help us grow and discover that which might not otherwise be known as possible. I would like to challenge our congregation from Ash Wednesday to Easter. We will be challenged by the new sermon series focusing on some of the teachings of Jesus... *Written in Red*. These teachings of Jesus will constantly challenge our status quo and cause us to look deep within our commitment to Him. We will be challenged!

As we respond to these teachings of Jesus, I would also like to specifically challenge our congregation to "Seven weeks and seven practices... a 46 Day Lenten Challenge."

The seven practices will come from the membership vows: PRAYERS, PRESENCE, GIFTS, SERVICE, and WITNESS; and incorporating the general rules of the church: DO GOOD, DO NO HARM, and STAY IN LOVE WITH THE LORD. So the 46 Day Challenge is living these vows and general rules together. What would this look like? I would call them seven practices to change us and the Church! The seven practices are...

PRAY... Pray every day, fast at least once a week.

STAY IN LOVE WITH GOD... Grow with the "written in red" words of Jesus and grow with others in Sunday School, and small groups with others.

PRESENCE... Worship at Shalimar UMC for seven straight weeks.

GIFTS... Give a tithe (10% of income) for 46 days... "Test me in this, says the Lord, and see if I will not open the floodgates of Heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." (Malachi 3:10)

DO GOOD DEEDS and **SERVE** others in some capacity each week. Be a blessing to others by surprising deeds and serving them. Jesus said if you want to be great be a servant. Put these words into practice.

DO NO HARM... Seek to help and not hinder others in their growth in the Lord. Seek to live in the power of the Holy Spirit and not do things or say things that harm others.

WITNESS... Invite at least one person to worship during the forty six days. Share your witness in Christ when opportunities present themselves.

I would like to invite all of us to devote ourselves to the teachings of Jesus and the tangible expressions in these seven practices of the church. If we are open to the challenge we will be transformed and our church will grow during these forty-six days of Lent. Are you up to the 46 Day Challenge? Let us pray daily, worship every week, stay in love with God, tithe, do good, do no harm, serve, and witness!

Members or Disciples?

As we consider the future of the church, the topics of membership and attendance come up often. These are two indicators of church health that we all focus on, sometimes with a good measure of anxiety. I am also one of those who look at attendance numbers every week, and try to draw conclusions about what is doing well and what is broken. But is this really the right approach?

Reading the gospels with my WWJD bracelet on, I am struck by the compelling story of Jesus' ministry. Not once do we hear him say, "You need to go to the temple every Sabbath," or "We'd love to have you join our synagogue." There are plenty of references to great crowds gathered around him, but no records of attendance or membership. There was no guilt trip for those who don't give a full tithe and no pressure to volunteer for the next Passover festival. He met them and taught them outside the synagogue more often than inside.

Jesus was always more focused on people returning to God, not joining the church; he said "Follow me," not "We missed you last week." He wanted disciples, not members. He offered a vision of a heavenly kingdom, not a new building or a cutting edge service. This is how the Apostles built the early church; it is also how our Methodist movement flourished.

The shift from membership to discipleship can be subtle, yet is often troubling for those who are satisfied with the way things are. Churches focused on membership try to get people to join. With a focus on discipleship, churches try to develop people who are increasing in their love of God and neighbor. Membership churches try to keep the members satisfied; discipleship churches try to foster spiritual growth, which usually takes them beyond their comfort zone. Membership churches encourage members to be more involved in church activities; discipleship churches encourage disciples to grow in obedience to God and service to others. Membership churches assume the responsibility for motivating people on their spiritual journey; discipleship churches provide opportunities and encouragement, while the disciples take responsibility for their own spiritual growth.¹

In the Jesus model of discipleship, the emphasis is about adopting a new "kingdom" way of living, not a new set of rules to follow. Relationships were more important than knowledge. An important marker for Jesus was unity of the Spirit, not uniformity of opinion. It was about process, not programs. It was about changing lives, not changing doctrine or filling schedules.

What would our church be like if we made the shift from membership to discipleship? What if we saw in each other our common need for spiritual growth? What if each of us focused first on our own discipleship journey, then helped others along the same path? What if the giving of our time and money were for the purpose of stretching ourselves and maturing as disciples of Christ? I have a hunch that membership and attendance would take care of themselves.

Pray this week and ask God to increase your compassion for those around you. Pray for more workers to go into the fields and help be the examples people need to guide them towards Christ. Pray that God will help you relinquish anything that is holding you back from becoming one of those workers. Most importantly, pray that those far from God will take the first step in his direction, then one more step after that.
