When I returned there was a letter in my box thanking Shalimar UMC for 100% participation with apportionments in 2017. Below is the letter I received.

Dear Philip:

As we settle into 2018, we want to take this opportunity to thank you for paying 100% of your apportionments to the ministry and mission of the United Methodist Church. Your faithfulness allowed ministry to happen here locally and to the ends of the world. You made a difference in the lives of many people. In addition, we witnessed record giving to disaster response in 2017. Thank you!

Shifting our Mental Gears

A common scenario plays out in many churches across the nation, regardless of size, brand, location, ethnic composition, or theological perspective. Perhaps you have seen it yourself. The congregation ages; younger families just starting out don't give as much as the generation before them; attendance drops; programs falter; the staff gets busier and more overworked, asking for additional staff, further challenging an already strained budget. As a result of these negative trends, the leadership of the church decides it is time to circle the wagons. They take a hard look at what is essential and what is expendable. They cut spending on missions, youth, and children; they downsize the VBS; they cut out the fall festival and the back-to-school outreach event; they stop marketing efforts and giveaways. In short, they abandon their mission to make disciples and embrace a new mission to preserve the institution. It never works. It never works because Christ's greatest strength was that he gave himself away, and that self-giving applies to the present-day body of Christ as well. "Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life." (John 12:25).

In this scenario, it is easy to conclude that the church begins to die when all the markers of vitality drop like attendance, giving, and professions of faith.

However, many churches have seen downward trends and gone on to greater strength. In reality, the church begins to die not when times get hard, but when the leaders shift their mental gears from generosity to survival. It happens when they decide to keep what they have instead of offer it to others.

Shalimar UMC does not fit the scenario described above, but sometimes it is tempting to shift gears. Our giving is increasing; our professions of faith remain strong; most of our programs are getting stronger, not weaker; volunteerism is up; missional giving is up. True, we do see an aging of the congregation and a drop in attendance, and these two things have been enough to raise the sense of alarm. Thankfully, our leadership is responding in faith rather than fear. There is a dogged determination not to circle the wagons, but to double down on our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

This resolve makes Shalimar an exciting place to be. In a few weeks, you will start seeing progress on the installation of our new playground. Our Master Planning committee is looking boldly into the possibilities of what our campus could be if we took discipleship seriously. Our Staff Parrish Relations committee is working to determine the staffing compliment that will best serve our mission. At every turn, I see a willingness to make the investments necessary to carry and expand our mission into the decades to come. We have great faith that God will make our efforts fruitful. I am confident we will soon be able to say, "Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass." (I Thess 5:24).
