Philip's Focus

Forty Three Years and Counting the Blessings

There may be an extra spring in my step this week! This week marks the forty-third anniversary of my call into ministry. In the final minutes of July 10th in the year of the Lord Nineteen Hundred and Seventy-Five, I stopped resisting God's prevenient grace and surrendered to the call of ministry. On July 11th, I announced before the whole camp at Blue Lake Methodist Assembly that God was calling me into ministry. My life has been forever different since that moment of decision on this evening at Blue Lake. In most ways, this was the beginning of my life!

My relationship with Jesus began gradually as a child and began to deepen in my youth years. When I was ten years old, I began praying every night. My prayers resembled a "wish list" when I first began praying and concluded with The Lord's Prayer that I learned at McCann's United Methodist Church. One night I prayed as if God were a friend of mine and was pleasantly surprised at how praying began to change my life and outlook.

These beginnings in my relationship with Christ moved into my years as a youth. Yet, I still had some resistance to becoming a disciple of Jesus in my everyday life. I was basically bored at church and went more out of duty and my parents encouragement than a desire to worship God.

My confidence suffered in my teen years, as I was painfully shy. My life was filled with fears, struggles, and guilt. Some preachers scared me with their messages of going to Hell. This fear approach would cause me to doubt my relationship with Jesus. I wavered back and forth with the certainty of my own salvation.

In my junior and senior year of High School, my fears kept me up at night. This "inner struggle" between assurance and doubt seemed to persist all the time. Sports (baseball and football) offered a great escape from this restlessness in my soul. In my senior year, I began to ponder my future vocation. My first choice was to play professional baseball, if I were not good enough be a coach. The other choice was to be a disc jockey as I was always fascinated with radio. Another option was passing thoughts of becoming a pastor. I wrote ministry off most of the time. After all, my older brother was already a United Methodist Pastor and I rationalized this was for him and not me.

About a month before graduation, I broke my leg sliding into second base and just like that, my baseball career was over. There would be no trip to the all-star game to hopefully catch the eye of a baseball scout. (I was and still am a dreamer!) As I finished high school on crutches this left me more time than I wanted to sit and think. My sitting still with a cast on my right leg began a short season of spiritual churning of all the unrest in my soul.

After graduating High School with a limp I felt like I was Jacob wrestling with angels and sometimes demons every night. This changed when my pastor, Reverend Wilbur Majors, invited me to go to Blue Lake Camp in July. I did not want to go but in a very uncharacteristic move Rev. Majors called Blue Lake before I said "yes" and registered me. As a result, I went unwillingly to experience what would become the greatest spiritual week of my life. Rev. Majors, by the way, was a very meek man and to my knowledge never had been so hold.

When I was at this camp on Christian vocations, every speaker and event ramped up the spiritual intensity that had been going on inside for two years. On the first day, one of the pastors shared he wanted to be a disc jockey but the Lord called him to preach. This story really began moving me toward that same conclusion. Now I was completely open to the call into ministry. Several days passed with each speaker and event and I became more convinced God was calling me into ministry.


The last night I was so stirred I felt my heart pounding in my chest. A question was asked by a leader of camp at the close of the night, "does anyone here feel called into ministry." My heart then started doing gymnastic flips but still I remained quiet. After the closing prayer for the night, I walked down that long hall of Oakwood Lodge and stood at my door. At that moment I decided I had resisted God long enough. I turned around and walked down the long hall at around midnight and knocked on the door of Dr. Asa Boozer. (He must have been thrilled.) He opened the door and the words quickly jumped out of my mouth, "God is calling me into ministry."

On this night with Dr. Boozer I said YES to go into ministry! At that moment two years of restlessness ended and there was a complete calm in my soul. The next day I told the whole camp. In the evening, I would tell my Dad and Mom. A few weeks later, I preached my first sermon at McCann's UMC. The next June, in 1976, I would receive my first appointment Coatopa while attending college at Livingston University. I have been under appointment ever since!

Forty-three years later I still remember that eventful week when I first said YES. Now, as I look back, I could have never imagined how many blessings of God would be in this journey. There have been great challenges but all have led to blessings! The best thing that happened in those 43 years was meeting and marrying Karen. Also, one of the greatest blessings of the years is to serve Shalimar UMC twice. Forty three years and counting the blessings! The spring in my step is because I'm so thankful God called me to do what I do. I love what I do! And I am excited to be at Shalimar! I am thankful and grateful for His call!
