

Philip's Focus

A Culture of Deeds of Shalom

This weekend is the last of six messages on "Keys to the Kingdom, Unlocking the Future of Our Church" from the Book of Acts chapters 3-4. In this series, we have challenged everyone to offer deeds of shalom! Deeds of shalom can be any act we offer to another person in the name of Jesus Christ. We have learned deeds of shalom are as simple as helping another person through a single act of kindness or offering a listening ear. Deeds of shalom are varied as our imagination will allow and as plentiful as our eyes remain open to see how we can love other people.

We have discovered these deeds can occur whenever and with whomever. These deeds provide a spark for new friendships and serving our neighbor. All and all, in the midst of the deeds, God's Kingdom is made known on this earth. What do deeds of shalom have to do with our future? Our growing future at Shalimar United Methodist Church emerges as we mobilize everyone in our congregation to simultaneously offer deeds of shalom. I nicknamed this the "shalom meter." We seek to increase and multiply the deeds of shalom from our church to community each week.

What we have been leading to in the previous six weeks is developing a culture of shalom in and through our church. The living into this culture of shalom is everyone's opportunity and responsibility. Each day opportunities will emerge for loving deeds of shalom. We only need to be aware of the daily possibility of acts of shalom. What are some of the takeaways from this series to help us remain aware of deeds of shalom?

- We become aware of potential deeds of shalom through loving Jesus and loving people.
- When we love people, we offer deeds to show our love.
- We need the Holy Spirit to fill us as happened for Peter and John.
- If we grow up in our discipleship, grow out to others, we grow together in deep unity (koinonia).
- We sometimes have to leave our comfort zone, and take risks, for Jesus.
- Where there are risks, there will be rewards, and fruit for the Kingdom.
- Our world is broken, divided, and fragmented.
- Jesus can bring us together.
- Shalom offers Jesus through deeds to bring wholeness, completeness, and peace for all people.
- Jesus is the reason our church exists and reaching this region for Jesus is our mission.
- If people do not come to us, we go to them and serve them in Jesus' name.
- The number of first time visitors will grow as our deeds of shalom grow.
- Methods of reaching people are not the same as they used to be in the church, but through deeds of shalom things can become better than they have ever been.
- Deeds of witness are everyone's responsibility in the church.

These are just some of the takeaways for continuing to grow a culture of deeds of shalom. Let us move that needle of the "shalom meter" in the coming days! May we stay focused on reaching this community and region for Jesus! Shalimar United Methodist Church's future becomes brighter with every deed of shalom! May our light shine and we give glory to our Heavenly Father!


